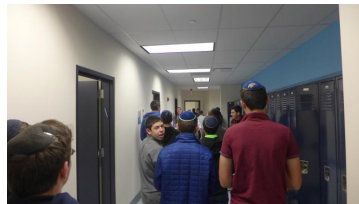

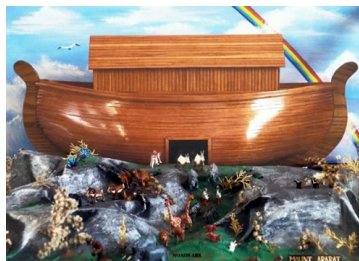

## TABC/ Sinai Lunch Buddies Program Begins

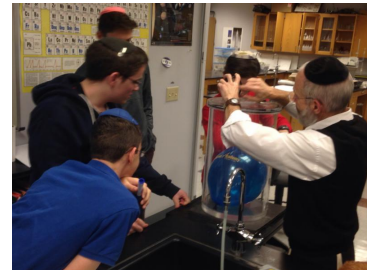
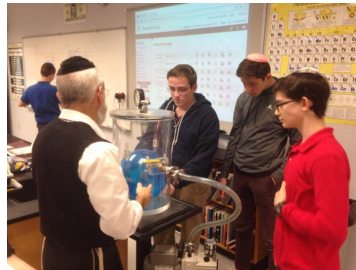

## Vacuum Chamber of Horrors

This week students learning in Doc's chemistry classes had hands on instruction into Boyle's Law. Accordingly, as external pressure decreases, a gas expands. (Perhaps you've noticed how a snack bag expands as a plane takes off. As the plane ascends external pressure decreases.) A balloon, partially filled with air, was placed in our vacuum chamber. The air was pumped out in increments. Volume was plotted against pressure. Results compared very favorably to Boyle's Law predictions.

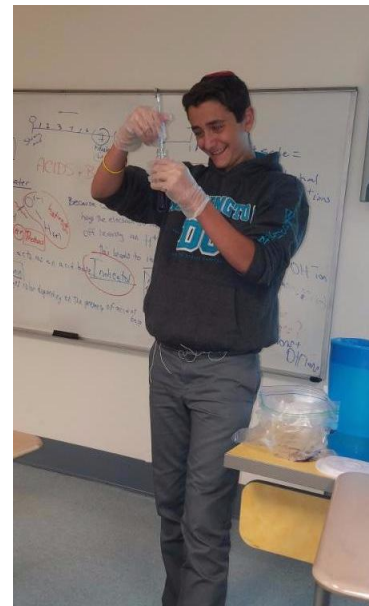
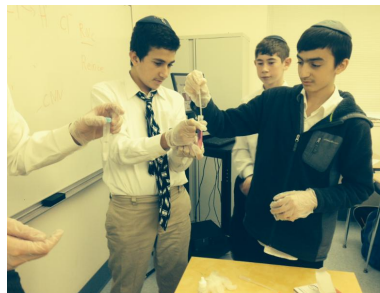
TABC's own Joshua Cohen, TABC class of 2007 this past week.

## TABC Teachers Train to Become Mentors

TABC is in its second year of participating in the Jewish New Teacher Project, a national program for Jewish day school educators that trains experienced teachers to be mentors to beginning teachers. JNTP mentors engage in a two year program involving intensive professional learning seminars, monthly web meetings with other mentors and coaching from JNTP staff, all of which enables them to work to support new teachers. Mentors meet weekly with their new teachers, who also participate in their own JNTP-sponsored professional development. Mentors facilitate the growth of new teachers in lesson planning, classroom management, and pedagogy, all while providing support during the often challenging first years of teaching.

Mrs. Nancy Edelman, now in her second year of mentor training, brought the JNTP program to TABC last year and this year Mrs. Deniera Goldenberg has joined the program. Both report that the program has not only helped the new teachers they work with, but has helped each of them reflect on and strengthen their own teaching practice.
