Torah & Science Elective Update

Some of the most exciting developments in the Torah and Science Elective occurs after class is over. After noting that the Big Bang Theory supports the Torah version of Creation (and rejects Aristotle's assertion of the world being eternal), Tani Greengart '18 sent me the following note:

Some scientists believe that there were multiple Big Bangs before the one 14 billion years ago, and that the universe is at least a trillion years old, and possibly infinitely old.

Rabbi Jachter decided to forward this question to the two top Orthodox scientists who have written extensively (and appeared as guest speakers at TABC) about the interface of Torah and Science, Dr. Nathan Aviezer and Dr. Gerald Schroeder. We were thrilled to receive prompt replies from both eminent authorities who responded in more or less the same manner. The following is Dr. Aviezer's response:

First of all, let me congratulate you (and Tani!) for having (being) such a bright student. As Tani correctly points out, some recent theories of physics assume the existence of multiple universes and multiple Big Bangs. These theories are still speculative, but let us assume that these theories eventually become confirmed. What are the implications of these theories for the Torah creation narrative?

It is important to realize that the Torah is not a science textbook. The Torah only includes information that is relevant to us, that is, to contemporary human beings. Therefore, it follows that the Torah is describing our universe and our Big Bang. The Torah word "creation" thus means the creation of our universe." Previous Big Bangs and other universes which have no connection with us

would not be included in the Torah.

Our class is fortunate indeed to have the support of Dr. Aviezer and Dr. Schroeder to help us in our efforts to grapple with conflicts between Torah and Science.


