

Mrs. Miller's ninth grade class, in preparation for their group project on The Odyssey, participated in the famous Marshmallow Challenge this week, and they learned that one fluffy marshmallow can bend a seemingly solid pasta tower. They used the Marshmallow Challenge as a springboard for a discussion about the characteristics of a successful group project: teamwork--everyone has a role and no single member of a group is the leader all of the time; prototyping--understanding that a single product will have many drafts before it can be finished; and play--the knowledge that there is no single "right answer" and that the best learning is active.
