

Distinguished Scholars Program Welcomes Rabbi Simcha Willig



The Distinguished Scholars Program was privileged to host Rabbi Simcha Willig this past week. Rabbi Willig addressed our students on the topic of how to distinguish between primary versus secondary sources, and why that distinction is relevant to their research. Rabbi Willig then reviewed an area of history that he has concentrated on:the unique model of teaching in the Slobodka school. Students were actively engaged and interested in hearing about the research process as well as

the fascinating and unique philosophical perspective of the Alter of Slabodka, an approach which gave rise to many Jewish institutions of learning today.

Dr. Harry Lieman Addresses

TABC Students

This past Friday, Dr. Harry Lieman, an Orthodox Jew who is a renowned fertility specialist and father of Josh Lieman '17, addressed a combined group of the Chassidic Thought, Jewish Philosophy and the Torah and Science electives. Dr. Lieman interactively outlined the very large number of potential problems a couple might encounter in their quest to have a child. He noted with great



wonder, though, at how eighty five percent of couples are able to produce a child in a year or less of attempting to do so despite the incredibly large number of potential pitfalls. Dr. Lieman noted this as an example of that which we say every day at Shacharit (Tehillim 104:24) "Mah rabu ma'asecha Hashem. Kulam b'chochma asita" ("O Lord, how manifold are Your works! In wisdom have you made them all.").

The presentation was very well-received and recognized as an important step in helping us all grow in our admiration and love of Hashem as well as adding another layer of meaning to our Tefillah.

Torah U'Madda: Psychology in the Parsha

Rabbi Dr. Schnall's AP Psychology students have been studying "context effects" -the impact of surroundings on one's perception of the environment -- and applying
this knowledge to Sefer Bereishit. Ask your son how context effects help us
understand the Netziv's view of why Yitzchak did not recognize Yaakov and
Yehudah did not recognize Tamar, and also the Ramban's explanation of why
Yosef's brothers did not recognize him in Egypt, as we read in this week's Parshat
Mikeitz.

Introductory Economics Class Hears from Jeff Miller



The 12th grade Introductory economics and Financial literacy course culminated their study of the role of the Federal Reserve with special guest speaker, Mr. Jeffrey Miller, husband of our own Allison Miller, of the English department. Having worked at the Federal Reserve Bank in New York for over seven years, Mr. Miller

shared his insights about the Fed and its role in our economy. In his presentation, Mr. Miller related the role played by the Fed in dealing with both past and present day economic crises. it is always so exciting for students to hear and see "real life" examples of the various theories and concepts being covered in their classes.
