## **Frog Dissection Hops Along**

We completed frog dissections in Biology lab this week. Students had a hands on experience into understanding the complexity of the internal anatomy of living things, which is the best tool for making a science unit come alive. Our students had an opportunity to examine and explore the various internal and external organs of the grass frog. Seeing these organs and understanding how they work within a single animal allows students to understand how the same systems work within themselves.



While we do not have all organs in common, many systems overlap with incredible similarities and give students a more thorough understanding and appreciation as to the complexity of living organisms. Students also learned the concept of for the rules, regulations, and schedule.
